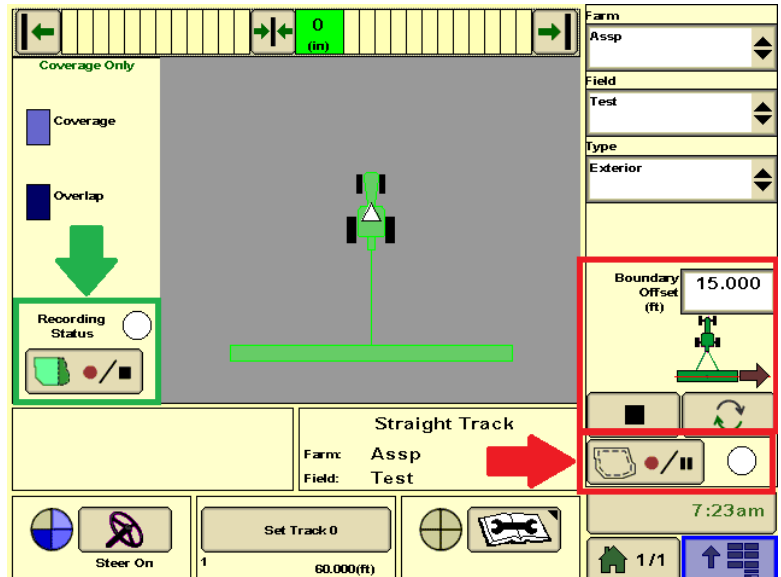


Boundary Misconceptions

1) Boundaries are meant to shut off planter clutches and sprayer sections when they get outside of the specified area or cross a waterway. Boundaries are NOT required to record coverage maps and as applied maps. We have heard from many customers that they make a new boundary ever time they enter a field to get it to record. That will only create more problems later. Unwanted boundaries should be deleted from Apex so they don't cause future problems. Boundaries cannot be shut off or disabled once you are in the field.

2) Sometimes customers make boundaries without even realizing it and they also say that they aren't recording a coverage map when they in fact are. Notice that there are 2 different record buttons on this home page. The record button in the red box means you are recording a boundary. The record button in the green box means you are recording a coverage map.



3) If you are going to make a boundary then you should create it using a RTK signal so that it doesn't drift over time. If your boundary drifts over time then your clutches and sections will be turning on and off at the wrong times and will need to be recreated. We also recommend using a Gator when making boundaries so that you can easily drive the perimeter of the field and get right to the corners of the field for the best boundary possible. You can buy a harness and brackets from us to equip your own Gator for \$599. We can also come out and create the boundaries and your AB lines for you for \$1 per acre with a minimum acreage required.
